The Mindarie Regional Council (MRC) was established to assist the seven Local Government Councils of: Cambridge, Joondalup, Perth, Stirling, Victoria Park, Vincent and Wanneroo to deal with their waste.

The MRC has waste education staff available to assist schools to develop new or existing waste and recycling programs. Just look what we can do for you:

Visit us and our facilities which include the Tamala Park landfill site and the Resource Recovery Facility (composting) at Neerabup. There is an Education Centre at Tamala Park with demonstrated projects for recycling. This includes worm farming, composting, sheet mulched garden beds, creative art work from junk and more.



A visitor's centre at the RRF shows the process of converting 'green lidded household bin' waste into compost at the facility and its subsequent use with interactive games and displays.



Information and assistance with the setting up of waste minimisation and recycling programs within schools and community venues. Projects may include organics recycling, worm farms, composting and school garden projects. Fridge worm farms are available by arrangement from Tamala Park. Other projects may include ideas and education for students, staff and parents for dealing with 'Household Hazardous Waste'. Schools are invited to take part in the dry celled battery recycling program.

Visits by our team to schools for talks and demonstrations for students, staff, parent groups or other community groups on all aspects of waste, including: organics recycling, waste minimisation and bin audits.





The Roaming Recycler, waste education trailer, for use at school and community events. It includes displays and games designed to get people thinking about waste issues.



Community education courses on 'waste' called Earth Carers. These courses give participants both broad and specific information and tools to address waste issues in a school, work and home situation.



Best of all, these **resources are free of charge**, and are tailored to the needs of the individual school and age group of the students. The MRC education staff work in conjunction with Waste Wise Schools and the local councils.
