Drone – Thermal Imagery

During the recent odour survey on site, discussions were had around thermal imagery. OC and ES discussed the heat being generated by the landfill and the potential of odours being drawn up with the heat.

- Informed DWER on 10.10.2024, 5.11.2024 and 20.11.2024 that the MRC will expose a small amount of waste for a short time to install sacrificial horizontal landfill gas wells
- Informed DWER on 27.11.2024 of capping works which involve the installation of new pipework/infrastructure to support leachate management

 DWER has contacted MRC regarding the issuing of an Environmental Protection Notice.

4. Leachate Management

Re-injection

Potential to re-inject leachate into suitable portions of the landfill. This will keep the moisture level up and reduce the risk of subterranean fires. Leachate being extracted from landfill gas extraction wells will be re-injected into landfill. This is so it isn't added to leachate ponds on surface of the landfill.

Leachate extraction pumps

6 landfill gas extraction wells have been impacted by leachate. This reduces the ability for landfill gas to be extracted from the well. Pumps can extract leachate within the well, thus providing more space within the well to collect landfill gas.

3 of the 4 Airwell pumps have been installed, while the two remaining require more specialised extraction pumps/ pipes due to the extraction wells being deformed or narrowed under compaction and usual movement within the landfill. These are expected to be installed by mid-December.


